CONTEXT ELEMENTS AND STRUCTURE

The French School of Kampala currently enrolls 265 students from Nursery to Première (high school) with 40 nationalities represented. The school's staff is composed of 23 teachers, 3 nursery assistants, 9 administrative staff including a school psychologist.

The school has an agreement with the Agency for French Education Abroad (AEFE).

The French school in Kampala is managed by a Management Committee (MC) of the Parents' Association (APE) and by a headmaster, a French civil servant appointed by the AEFE.

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JOB DESCRIPTION - ENGLISH TEACHER FOR PRIMARY CYCLE

Key duties and responsibilities

To plan, prepare and deliver lessons to a range of classes and age groups, in line with the Cambridge English curriculum objectives

- In consultation with other teachers, to prepare lessons in other subjects taught in English (e.g. Science, Arts, Sport...)
- Promote proficiency in the four language skills: reading comprehension, oral comprehension, written expression, oral expression.
- encourage learner interactions in the classroom through active, various and differentiated learning methods.

To implement with the Headteacher the opening of the "British international section" (September 2024), linked with the French curriculum of "international sections".

To assess, monitor, record and report on the learning needs, progress and achievement of each pupil

- to do regular and prompt corrections of all assessment exercises and assignments completed by the pupils.
- to mark and provide appropriate feedback on oral and written work.
- to display the pupils' work, and ensure that the classroom is attractively decorated and conducive to learning

To maintain good order and discipline among the students, enforcing classroom rules and regulations in the classroom and around the school.

- to meet with parents or guardians and discuss pupils' academic progress, remedial issues and establish and maintain open lines of communication with pupils and their parents regarding academic and behavioural progress (and behaviour problems when necessary.)
- to serve as a role model for the pupils by showing respect for rules set by the School management and assisting in their implementation.

To participate in the professional development trainings organized by the School and be updated with new developments and methods related to his/her teaching field

To participate in all staff and planning meetings.
